

Newton Tony CE VC School PE and Sports Premium Funding in 2019-2020

Newton Tony VC CE Primary School received a sum of £16000 and an additional £10 per pupil, totalling £16,512, to promote sport within the school. We will receive £6858 of our funding allocation on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and £9654 on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2019. We carried forward £8942 from a two year combined underspend (2017-2018 rollover of £4000 and 2018-2019 rollover of £4942). We are committed to providing good quality physical education to all our pupils enabling them to have access to opportunities throughout the year. Our school will use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer. This means that we will use the premium to: develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers: build capacity and capability within our school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

There are 5 key indicators that our school should expect to see improvement across:

- 1.The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- 2.The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3.Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4.Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5.Increased participation in competitive sport
