



## Expectations and Requirements for September 2022

Dear Children and Parents,

Welcome to Foxes Class! Our new class teacher is Mrs Victoria Copping and we welcome her to our school family. Mrs Natalie Smith is the new class Teaching Assistant. Mrs Copping will be dismissing the children from the field gate every afternoon if you wish to introduce yourself.

### Daily timings

Children need to arrive at school for 9.00am, entering through the side gate. Children with siblings in Squirrels or Badgers class will be able to join 'Sibling Squad' on the playground from 8.30am. The school day finishes for us at 3.00 p.m. We will dismiss children from the gate on the field.

### Class dojo


Class dojo's will be used to reward children. The child who receives the highest dojo points at the end of the week receives a leaf for their House. Once each house has received 10 leaves they receive a Golden Leaf which entitles that House to choose a reward. Each class will be given a reward, for example watching a film, when they reach 50 or 100 points.

### Uniform and PE Kit:-

Our Newton Tony Primary School uniform must be worn at all times, unless it is a PE/Games day or another 'pre authorised' occasion. Please remember that all Foxes Class may be wearing the same size jumper so it **must** be clearly **named** so that we can return it to the correct child! School shoes should be black and in the summer heel-supported sandals may be worn. Socks or tights must be either black or grey. Trainers are only to be worn for PE/Games lessons.

On PE days, children are asked to wear a PE kit consisting of a purple T-shirt, black shorts or skort and sensible trainers to school on PE days. For colder days a pair of plain black jogging bottoms or black leggings and sweater may be required. Please ensure all kit is named - again all children have similar sized clothing.

Our PE days this term will be **Thursday and Friday**.



## Outdoor learning

Outdoor learning clothes also need to be labelled and should consist of:

- wellies
- water proof trousers
- coat

The children really enjoy their time outside, and it is a valuable part of their learning. With autumn fast approaching, it is important to have the right clothing. These clothes will be kept in school unless you ask otherwise, or they need washing!

## Equipment: -

We will provide **ALL** the equipment required to complete learning at school. **Can we ask that children bring book bags into school, rather than rucksacks.** There is not a lot of room on their pegs, the cloakroom becomes very bulky. Book bags can be stored neatly near the classroom. Book bags need to have the child's name written **on the outside** so that they can be located quickly.

**Jewellery is not to be worn**, apart from wearing a sensible watch or plain 'stud' earrings. A friendship bracelet or memory bracelet may be worn on special occasions. Nail varnish should not be worn to school. We advise keeping toys at home in case they are lost.

## Water and Fruit: -

Please can your child bring to school a **named** water bottle, containing **ONLY** plain **water**, this should be brought in every day. Fruit is provided for your child as a mid-morning snack.

## Reading books: -

As part of our phonic scheme 'Little Wandle' reading books will **ONLY** be changed once a week. Children will also bring home a story, poetry or factual book to share with you. More details on reading books, spellings and other homework will follow at a later date.

## Communication books

If you have any concerns or worries please write in the book and we will try to answer any questions you have. All communication books will be looked at daily and we will also keep you up to date using these books.
