#### **Our School Vision**

Our school is a safe, welcoming and nurturing school that offers a sense of belonging. We are situated in a small, rural village and we pride ourselves that we know each and every child. Our strength lies in putting the needs of the child at the heart of everything we do. We offer an exciting and stimulating curriculum, with high quality teaching that provides a rich, rewarding and enjoyable learning environment for all. Through a solid partnership working with parents, our church and Her Majesty's Armed forces, we encourage children to become confident, caring and independent young learners. We believe that 'Everyone cares and Everyone counts'

In our school our vision is underpinned by the bible verse 'Love One Another As I Have Loved You' (John 15:12); it shapes all we do.

## 1.Main points

Our school governing body and Wiltshire local authority, subject to the limited exceptions referred to in the dfe guidance, cannot charge for education provided during school hours (including the supply of any materials, books, instruments or other equipment.

Sections 449-462 of the Education Act 1996 sets out the law on charging for school activities in schools maintained by local authorities in England.

Schools must ensure that they inform parents on low incomes and in receipt of the benefits of the support available to them when being asked for contributions towards the cost of school visits. ## 2. School charging

#### Education

- a)The school governing body and Wiltshire local authority cannot charge for:
- an admission application to any state funded school paragraph 1.9 (n) of the 'School Admissions Code 2012' rules out requests for financial contributions as any part of the admissions process;
- education provided during school hours (including the supply of any materials, books, instruments or other equipment);
- education provided outside school hours if it is part of the national curriculum, or part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school, or part of religious education;
- instrumental or vocal tuition, for pupils learning individually or in groups, unless the tuition is provided at the request of the pupil's parent;
- entry for a prescribed public examination, if the pupil has been prepared for it at the school; and examination re-sit(s) if the pupil is being prepared for the re-sit(s) at the school.

b. Schools and local authorities can charge for:

- any materials, books, instruments, or equipment, where the child's parent wishes him/her to own them;
- optional extras (see 3 below);
- music and vocal tuition, in limited circumstances (see page 6);
- certain early years provision;
- community facilities

#### 3. Optional extras

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School may charge for some activities that are known as 'optional extras'. Where an optional extra is being provided, a charge can be made for providing materials, books, instruments, or equipment.

#### Optional extras are:

education provided outside of school time that is not:

- part of the national curriculum;
- part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school; or part of religious education.
- examination entry fee(s) if the registered pupil has not been prepared for the examination(s) at the school;
- transport (other than transport that is required to take the pupil to school or to other premises where the local authority/governing body have arranged for the pupil to be provided with education);
- board and lodging for a pupil on a residential visit;
- extended day services offered to pupils (for example breakfast club, after-school clubs, tea and supervised homework sessions).

In calculating the cost of optional extras an amount may be included in relation to:

- any materials, books, instruments, or equipment provided in connection with the optional extra;
- the cost of buildings and accommodation;
- · non-teaching staff;
- teaching staff engaged under contracts for services purely to provide an optional extra, this includes supply teachers engaged specifically to provide the optional extra; and
- the cost, or an appropriate proportion of the costs, for teaching staff employed to provide tuition in playing a musical instrument, or vocal tuition, where the tuition is an optional extra.

Any charge made in respect of individual pupils must not exceed the actual cost of providing the optional extra activity, divided equally by the number of pupils participating. It must not therefore include an element of subsidy for any other pupils wishing to participate in the activity whose parents are unwilling or unable to pay the full charge. Furthermore in cases where a small proportion of the activity takes place during school hours the charge cannot include the cost of alternative provision for those pupils who do not wish to participate.

Therefore no charge can be made for supply teachers to cover for those teachers who are absent from school accompanying pupils on a residential visit. Participation in any optional extra activity will be on the basis of parental choice and a willingness to meet the charges. Parental agreement is therefore a necessary pre-requisite for the provision of an optional extra where charges will be made.

### 5. Voluntary contributions

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School agrees that nothing in legislation prevents a school governing body or local authority from asking for voluntary contributions for the benefit of the school or any school activities. However, if the activity cannot be funded without voluntary contributions, the governing body or head teacher should make this clear to parents at the outset. The governing body or head teacher must also make it clear to parents that there is no obligation to make any contribution.

It is important to note that no child should be excluded from an activity simply because his or her parents are unwilling or unable to pay. If insufficient voluntary contributions are raised to fund a visit, or the school cannot fund it from some other source, then it must be cancelled. Schools must ensure that they make this clear to parents. If a parent is unwilling or unable to pay, their child must still be given an equal chance to go on the visit. Schools should make it clear to parents at the outset what their policy for allocating places on school visits will be.

When making requests for voluntary contributions, parents must not be made to feel pressurised into paying as it is voluntary and not compulsory. Schools should avoid sending colour coded letters to parents as a reminder to make payments and direct debit or standing order mandates should not be sent to parents when requesting contributions.

5. Extended day services offered to pupils

a.Breakfast Club

At Newton Tony CE VC Primary School we fund Breakfast Club for families in receipt of Service Family Premium. Charges are £2.50 for each daily session, with a reduction to £2.00 a daily session for each sibling.

b.After School Club

At Newton Tony CE VC Primary School we fund Breakfast Club for families in receipt of Service Family Premium. There are two daily sessions with the following charges, these timings are currently:

Session 1 £4.50 (3.00pm - 4.15pm)

Session 2 £4.50 (4.15 pm - 5.30pm)

Both sessions £8.00 in total (3.00pm – 5.30pm)

There will a deduction of £1.00 from each session total for families with more than one child eg. £3.50 per session or £7.00 for both sessions

### Late charging

## Session 1

Parents/carers will incur a charge for <u>both</u> sessions if their child is collected after 4.15pm. This charge applies for every child in the family that is attending the club.

## Session 2

Parents/carers will incur a charge of £5 for every 5 minutes their child is collected after 5.30pm. This charge applies for every child in the family that is attending the club. eg. if two children are collected at 5.35pm the charge will be £10

6.Music Tuition

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School agrees that although the law states that, in general, all education provided during school hours must be free, instrumental and vocal music tuition is an exception to that rule.

The Charges for Music Tuition (England) Regulations 2007 set out the circumstances in which charges can be made for tuition in playing a musical instrument, including vocal tuition. They allow charging for tuition in larger groups than was previously the case.

Charges may now be made for vocal or instrumental tuition provided either individually, or to groups of any size, provided that the tuition is provided at the request of the pupil's parent. Charges may not exceed the cost of the provision, including the cost of the staff who provide the tuition.

The regulations make clear that charging may not be made if the teaching is either an essential part of the national curriculum, or is provided under the first access to the key stage 2 Instrumental and Vocal Tuition Programme. They also make clear that no charge may be made in respect of a pupil who is looked after by a local authority (within the meaning of section 22(I) of the Children Act 1989).

## 7.Transport

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School <u>cannot</u> charge for:

- transporting registered pupils to or from the school premises, where the local education authority has a statutory obligation to provide transport;
- transporting registered pupils to other premises where the governing body or local authority has arranged for pupils to be educated:
- transport that enables a pupil to meet an examination requirement when he has been prepared for that examination at the school; and transport provided in connection with an educational visit.

# 8.Residential visits

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School cannot charge for:

• education provided on any visit that takes place during school hours;

- education provided on any visit that takes place outside school hours if it is part of the national curriculum, or part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school, or part of religious education;
- supply teachers to cover for those teachers who are absent from school accompanying pupils on a residential visit.

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School can charge for:

• board and lodging and the charge must not exceed the actual cost.

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School makes it clear that parents who can prove they are in receipt of certain benefits will be exempt from paying the cost of board and lodging.

#### 9. Education partly during school hours

Newton Tony CE VC Primary School agrees that where an activity takes place partly during and partly outside school hours, there is a basis for determining whether it is deemed to take place either inside or outside school hours. However, a charge can only be made for the activity outside school hours if it is not part of the national curriculum, not part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school and not part of religious education.

Any extended day services for day pupils at state boarding schools, and the associated charges, must be optional. Schools cannot make attendance at and the payment of charges for extended day services compulsory.

#### 10. Financial difficulties

At Newton Tony CE VC Primary School, no child will be excluded from any curriculum-based activity purely because of an inability to pay. Parents who have any difficulty in making voluntary contributions are requested to come into school and talk to the Headteacher in the strictest confidence.
