This week

The children followed a trail of vegetables around the school until we discovered a special book called 'Oliver's Vegetables'. We learnt all about his Grandpa's garden and tried some of the vegetables from the story, including beetroot, carrots, peas and spinach. They all had an amazing 'have a go' attitude, and some of us were surprised by how many we enjoyed but they all agreed that the peas were their favourite!

We also learned about Chinese New Year. We tried some delicious food, looked at traditional clothing and even had a go at writing some Chinese numerals!

In maths we have been comparing sets of objects, using the language of 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'an equal number' to describe them. We have also been consolidating the order of the first 10 numbers and understanding that the position that each number holds in our number sequence does not change.

Today we celebrated World Book Day. We learnt some poetry and explored lots of different books in our play. The children all looked fabulous in their costumes!
